The reading of the minutes of the March 14, 2006 meeting, which had previously been distributed, was dispensed with and upon motion duly made and seconded the minutes of said meeting were unanimously adopted.

The Executive Director then called upon George Hill, Managing Architect, to present to the Board of Commissioners for approval proposed Change Orders to various contracts not requiring an increase to the project budgets marked Exhibit "A". Liquidated

damages assessed against various contracts marked Exhibit "B" were also reported. After discussion and consideration, and upon motion duly made and seconded, the following resolution was adopted:

- ♦ A report concerning proposals by property management firms for property manager of the Richard J. Daley Center. Staff recommended that the board extend the MB Real Estate property manager agreement for a period not to exceed two months in order to complete its evaluation of the proposals and the Committee concurred.

- ♦ A report concerning the pre-qualification of additional general contractors for various categories of projects undertaken by PBC. The report was accepted.
- ♦ A report concerning recommendation for the board to appoint Wight and Company as architect of record for the new Ninth District Police Station. Following discussion, the recommendation was approved.
- ♦ A report by Legal Counsel regarding the proposed settlement of a relocation assistance claim by Ann Chong d/b/a Father & Sons Cleaners for the Beverly Branch Library and a settlement offer by USG for a claim filed by PBC regarding the Richard J. Daley Center.

The Executive Director advised the Commissioners that the Public Building Commission has placed Public Officials Liability Insurance, effective March 1, 2006, with limits of \$2,000,000 (\$50,000 deductible) for an annual premium of \$57,775 to protect the Commission, board members, officers and persons who act on its behalf against claims alleging negligence, wrongful acts, errors and omissions, misleading statements, misrepresentations and breach of duty. Legal Counsel advised the Commissioners that it has provided a legal opinion to the Commission last year that the purchase of public officials liability insurance by a public agency no longer waived any of the immunities afforded by the Tort Immunity Act. After discussion and consideration, and upon motion duly made and seconded, the following resolution was adopted:

### **RESOLUTION NO. 6906**

BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Commissioners of the Public Building Commission of Chicago hereby approves the renewal of Public Officials Liability Insurance with limits of \$2,000,000 (\$50,000 deductible), for an annual premium of \$57,775 for the Public Building Commission and its officials and employees, effective March 1, 2006.

Legal Counsel first presented to the Board of Commissioners in Executive Session consideration of approval of the proposed settlement of a relocation claim submitted by Ann Chong d/b/a Father & Son Cleaners, for the property located at 1948 W. 95<sup>th</sup> Street required for the new Beverly Branch Library project. The Commissioners were advised that on November 15, 2005 and December 13, 2005 the Chicago Public Library Board and the Public Building Commission respectively approved settlement of the condemnation action to acquire the six unit commercial property located at 1940-54 W. 95<sup>th</sup> Street. The Public Building Commission will take full possession of and title to the subject property in April, 2006. Father & Son Cleaners has occupied 1948 W. 95<sup>th</sup> Street for over nine years and Ms. Chong is relocating her business to 3414 W. 79<sup>th</sup> Street, Chicago, Illinois. After review of various relocation documents submitted by Father & Son Cleaners to support its relocation claim and consultation with PBC's relocation consultant, Urban Relocation Services Inc., Legal Counsel recommended approval of the amount of \$50,225.00 in accordance with the various provisions of the Uniform Relocation Act and the Public Building Commission's relocation policies.

Next, Legal Counsel presented a report to the Board of Commissioners concerning the proposed settlement of claim against United States Gypsum (USG) with regard to asbestos at the Richard J. Daley Center. Legal Counsel advised the Commissioners that PBC and the City of Chicago jointly retained legal counsel (Dies & Hile) to pursue asbestos remediation claims in the bankruptcy proceedings of several asbestos manufacturers. In January 2003, an asbestos claim was filed on behalf of the Daley Center for approximately \$98 million in the United States Gypsum (USG) bankruptcy proceedings. Legal Counsel in the bankruptcy proceeding have advised that USG has offered to settle the PBC claim for \$33,298,217.72 (less attorney fees and costs). Legal Counsel advised the Commissioners that the offer was time sensitive and recommended approval of the settlement offer.

At the conclusion of the Executive Session, the meeting was reconvened and the following resolution was adopted:

### **RESOLUTION NO. 6912**

BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Commissioners of the Public Building Commission of Chicago does hereby approve the settlement of the relocation claim by Ann Chong, d/b/a Father & Son Cleaners, for the property located at 1948 W. 95<sup>th</sup> Street required for the new Beverly Branch Library project for the sum of \$50,225.00.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that Legal Counsel and staff of the Commission are hereby authorized to execute such documents and undertake such action as may be necessary and appropriate in order to effectuate the settlement of the relocation claim approved by this Resolution.
