## **Program Statistics**

- Program Cost Status
  - Our current program authority exceeds \$2 B in project development costs.
  - Under Budget by 5.11%, representing \$108 MM in projected surplus.
- Active Projects Construction Change Order %
  - Average percent of change for all PBC demolition, site prep and construction with a projected value of \$1.095 B is 2.8%, the industry standard change order percentage for new municipal and educational construction work is 3-5%.





#### **Environmental Sustainability**

#### **Economic Sustainability Programs**

- Programs Include:
  - Bid incentives for the employment of apprentices
  - Bid incentives for the employment of minority and female workers
  - Contract provisions that require at least 50% of the labor force be residents of the City of Chicago.
  - Contract provisions with regard for community hiring, helping to employ those closest to the work at hand
  - Contract provisions that require minority- and women-owned business participation
  - Contract provisions that require Chicago General Contractors awarded PBC projects to subcontract at least 25% of the contract worth to Chicago subcontractors. General Contractors not located in Chicago must award at least 35% of the work to local subcontractors



## Economic Sustainability: 2009 M/WBE Performance

- M/WBE Performance
  - 14 Projects opened
  - Total Value of Contracts Awarded: \$331,912,651.07
  - Total Paid to Date Amount: \$296,471,611.53
  - Total M/WBE Commitment: \$132,591,393.70 or 40%
    - Total MBE 33.83% (\$ 112,292,007.80)
    - Total WBE 6.12% (\$20,315,019.26)
  - Total M/WBE Paid to Date: \$117,662,127.87 or 40%
    - Total MBE 34.05% (\$100,937,320.22)
    - Total WBE 5.64% (\$16,724,807.65)



#### Economic Sustainability: 3<sup>rd</sup> Quarter: 2010 M/WBE Performance

- M/WBE Commitment through Q3
  - 14 GC projects, 11 JOC projects, 1 Special project & 1 CM at Risk project
  - Total Value of Contracts Awarded: \$293,295,976.79
    - Total MBE 26.80%
    - Total WBE 5.08%
- M/WBE Compliance through Q3
  - 10 GC projects, 2 JOC projects & 3 Special projects reached completion
  - Total Value: \$197,174,288.64
    - Total MBE 33.34%
    - Total WBE 5.48%

#### **Economic Sustainability Provisions**

- PBC supports maximum participation by MBEs and WBEs in Construction and in Professional Services and all program phases – Planning, Design and Construction
- New provisions adopted in 2009 to foster Local Business participation
- Continued priority to providing Construction Job opportunities for City Residents and for Minority and Women in the Trades
- Expanded goals for Community Hiring



#### New Local Subcontracting Requirements

Local General Contractors must award 25% to subcontractors to Local Subcontractors

General Contractors that are not Local Businesses must award 35% to Local Subcontractors

"Local" contractors:

- own or lease a functioning business office and/or operations facilities the City
- · are registered and licensed to do business in the City
- employ City residents
- are subject to City of Chicago taxes



#### **Changes to Local Hiring Provisions**

- Community Hiring Construction Jobs for residents of the community in which the project is located
- Community hiring now required on all PBC projects
- Community hiring goal increased from 5% to 7.5% of project labor

## LCP Tracker

- EEO:
  - Electronic submission of weekly certified payrolls via LCP Tracker
  - Certificate of Apprenticeship from U.S. Department of Labor, Bureau of Apprenticeship and Training
- Reporting:
  - EEO reports generated via LCP Tracker
- Enforcement mechanisms
  - Assessment of Liquidated Damages for EEO and City residency non-compliance
  - Responsible Vendor: EEO and City residency liquidated damages assessments reviewed



## City of Chicago Residency Program

- Requirement
  - The GC must employ 50% of the total work force using city residents.
  - Measured by total hours worked.



#### **Community Hiring Bonus Program**

- GCs are:
  - Are required to provide 7.5% of the total labor hours using residents of the project's community.

- M/WBE Utilization Plan submitted with bid

- Schedule A: Contractor's Sworn Statements for Partial Payment and Partial Waivers of Lien
- Reporting:
  - M/WBE Commitment verses Actual Reporting
- Enforcement mechanisms
  - Responsible Vendor: M/WBE past performance reviewed
