The Executive Director advised the Commissioners that Chairman Johnson had requested to attend the meeting via remote participation for reasons stated in the Open Meetings Act. Chairman Johnson then advised that a public participation period would be conducted pursuant to Section 2.06(g) of the Open Meetings Act and the guidelines for comments established by Resolution No. 7611 approved by the Board of Commissioners on January 11, 2011. George Blakemore provided comments regarding the need for more jobs and contracting

opportunities for Black people. Tiwon Sims provided comments regarding various incidents allegedly involving arrests and criminality on several occasions in the City of Chicago.

Following the conclusion of the public participation period, the Commissioners were presented with consideration of approval of the minutes of the Regular Meeting of the Board of Commissioners held on August 12, 2025. The reading of said minutes, which had previously been distributed, was dispensed with and upon motion duly made and seconded, the minutes of the August 12, 2025 board meeting were unanimously approved.

The next item on the agenda was a report by Commissioner Randall regarding the Audit Committee meeting held on September 3, 2025. The report of the Audit Committee meeting is summarized as follows:

The Director of Procurement provided a report regarding a recommendation for the selection of a firm to provide Audit Services to the Public Building Commission. The Audit Committee accepted the report.

Next, the Commissioners were presented with a report by Commissioner Maldonado regarding the Administrative Operations Committee held on September 3, 2025. The Administrative Operations Committee report is summarized as follows:

The Director of Procurement presented five (5) task order awards for Environmental Engineering, Surveyor, and Geotechnical Specialty Consultant Services.

The Director of Procurement also reported a recommendation for the selection of a firm to provide Insurance Brokerage Services. These services include property/casualty, crime, bonds, directors' and officers' liability, and health benefits for the PBC. The Executive Director will provide further details during his report.

The Executive Director reported that there were no Field Orders exceeding the reporting threshold and recommended the ratification of the following Change Orders for CDOT Projects:

- South Central Park and East 91st Street: Credit amount of (\$100,000.00)
- West 100th Street, S. Homan Ave., and S. Short St.: Credit amount of (100,000.00)

The next item on the agenda was consideration of approval of the appointment of a firm to provide Audit Services to the Public Building Commission of Chicago. Executive Director Giderof advised the Commissioners that a Request for Proposals (RFP) for Audit Services was issued by the Public Building Commission on July 16, 2025. The services described in the RFP

included the examination of the Public Building Commission's financial statements and the rendering of an opinion on the fair presentation of the financial position and the changes in financial position and cash flows in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States. Four (4) proposals were received in response to the RFP from the following firms: Cherry Bekaert LLP; CliftonLarsonAllen LLP; Crowe LLP; and Macias Gini & O'Connell LLP. An Evaluation Committee, comprised of representatives from user departments and subject matter experts, reviewed the proposals based upon the following criteria: qualifications, experience and Key Personnel; project approach; past performance and references; pricing; and commitment to Minority- and Women-Owned Business Enterprise (MBE/WBE) participation and plans to achieve stated goals. After careful consideration including a thorough review of comparable services performed for other governmental entities and an in-dept analysis of pricing structures offered for similar audit engagements in the public sector, the Evaluation Committee recommended the appointment of CliftonLarsonAllen LLP based upon the firm's demonstrated public-sector audit expertise, strong and well-defined technical approach, the high qualifications of its proposed engagement team and comprehensive transition plan. The audit team includes Prado & Renteria, a certified Minority and Women Business Enterprise firm. Upon motion duly made and seconded, the following resolution was adopted:

RESOLUTION NO. 8796

BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Commissioners hereby appoints CliftonLarsonAllen LLP to provide Audit Services to the Public Building Commission pursuant to a Master Term Agreement with a not-to-exceed amount of \$140,000 for the first year with an initial term of three (3) years, with the option for the Commission in its sole discretion to extend the contract for up to three(3) additional one (1)-year periods.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Executive Director of the Public Building Commission is hereby authorized and directed to negotiate the terms of

the contract and to execute such documents, upon approval by Legal Counsel as to form and legality, as may be necessary and appropriate in order to effectuate this Resolution.

The next item on the agenda was consideration of approval to appoint a firm to provide Insurance Brokerage Services for property/casualty, crime, bonds, directors' and officers' liability and health benefits to the Public Building Commission of Chicago. The Executive Director advised the Commissioners that, on July 8, 2025, the Public Building Commission issued a Request for Proposals (RFP) for Insurance Brokerage Services in three (3) categories of insurance: (1) Property/Casualty; (2) Crime, Bonds, and Directors and Officers Liability; and (3) Health Benefits Services. In response to the RFP, targeted outreach, extensive publication, and a well-advertised pre-submission conference, the Public Building Commission received one (1) proposal by August 13, 2025, from Alliant Insurance Services, Inc. An Evaluation Committee comprised of representatives from the user departments and subject matter experts evaluated the proposal on the basis of the following criteria: Qualifications, experience, and past performance; References and reference responses; Project approach, market access, and quality assurance; Qualifications and relevant experience of proposed key personnel; Commitment to Minority- and Women-Owned Business Enterprise (MBE/WBE) participation; and cost proposal for each category. After careful consideration, including benchmarking against comparable services provided to other governmental entities, as well as pricing evaluation for similar services in the

governmental sector, the Evaluation Committee recommended the appointment of Alliant Insurance Services, Inc. based its demonstrated expertise, commitment to maximizing MBE/WBE participation, tailored approach to the Commission's unique insurance needs. The team includes Cynasure Insurance, a certified Minority and Women Business Enterprise firm and J.A. Watts, Inc., a certified Women Business Enterprise firm. Alliant has proposed a reduction in their current fee, resulting in an estimated savings of \$1,500 over the initial three (3)- year term of the Agreement. Upon motion duly made and seconded, the following resolution was approved:

BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Commissioners hereby appoints Alliant Insurance Services, Inc. to provide Insurance Brokerage Services – Categories 1, 2 and 3 (property/casualty; crime, bonds and Directors and Officers Liability; and health benefits) to the Public Building Commission pursuant to a Master Term Agreement with a not-to-exceed amount of \$121,500 per year, with an initial term of three (3) years, with two (2)-optional one-year extensions exercisable solely at the Commission's discretion.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Executive Director of the Public Building Commission is hereby authorized and directed to negotiate the terms of the Master Term Agreement and to execute, upon approval by Legal Counsel as to form and legality, such documents as may be necessary and appropriate in order to effectuate this Resolution.

The next item on the agenda was a report by the Executive Director regarding regular reports, development status and other matters. He advised the Commissioners regarding the

following Public Building Commission activities and events that have occurred since the last board meeting:

- On August 13, 2025, the Public Building Commission in partnership with Chicago Department of Transportation (CDOT) Acting Commissioner Craig Turner joined 15th Ward Alderman Ray Lopez at a Ground-Breaking Ceremony for the Works Progress Administration (WPA) Street Reconstruction Project in the vicinity of West 58th Street and South Hoyne. The General Contractor, MQ Construction Company, and community residents also participated in the event as part of Mayor Johnson's commitment to improving the City's infrastructure, enhancing safety and supporting vibrant, accessible neighborhoods.
- On August 14, 2025, the Public Building Commission staff joined First (1st) Ward Alderman Daniel La Spata and the Chicago Department of Transportation (CDOT) to host a community meeting regarding the Alley Reconstruction Project at North Milwaukee Avenue. The purpose of the meeting was to share the anticipated project schedule and present the contractor's proposed phasing and logistics plan to community residents and local businesses.
- On August 18 and August 19, 2025, the Public Building Commission joined Mayor Johnson, Alderman Emma Mitts, Chicago Public Schools' officials and other members of the community to welcome students back to school at the Austin College and Career Academy High School, Emmett Till Math and Science Academy and the James Farmer Junior Elementary School.
- On September 4, 2025, Public Building Commission staff attended the City of Chicago
 Procurement Symposium at Malcolm X College. This event provided a valuable
 opportunity for the Public Building Commission to support the City's efforts and connect

with firms seeking to learn more about the procurement process and available contracting opportunities.

Finally, Executive Director Giderof reported that, on September 18, 2025, the Public Building Commission will host students at the Public Building Commission who are currently enrolled in the Chicago Public Schools' Chicago Builds Program. The program is a City-wide two (2)-year off campus construction training program for CPS juniors and seniors interested in pursuing careers in the construction industry after high school graduation. Further details will be provided during the October 1, 2025, board meeting.

At the conclusion of the remarks and acknowledgements, the report by the Executive Director was accepted.

The next item on the agenda was consideration of approval of an Undertaking Request from the City of Chicago for the Department of Family and Support Services Bronzeville Regional Senior Center located at 4711-4755 South Calumet Avenue. The Executive Director advised the Commissioners that Department of Family & Support Services (DFSS), Department of Fleet and Facility Management (2FM) and the Office of Budget and Management (OBM) of the City of Chicago have requested approval of an Undertaking Budget for the proposed new Bronzeville Regional Senior Center located at 4711-4755 S. Calumet Avenue (the "Project"). The Project will include community and administrative spaces along with site improvements in support of DFSS' senior programming. The scope of services to be provided by the Public Building will include, but is not limited to, planning, due diligence, design, pre-construction, procurement, construction, closeout and associated management services. The amount of Undertaking Budget is \$29,000,000, inclusive of the \$2,000,000 Partial Undertaking Budget previously approved. The Executive Director acknowledged Alderman Pat Dowell, who has long championed this project. Alderman Dowell thanked the PBC and city for their partnership on

this important project. The Project will proceed pursuant to the 2021 Master Intergovernmental Agreement (IGA) between the Public Building Commission and the City of Chicago. Funding for the Project will be coordinated by OBM including any requirements associated with funding sources, grant and/or TIF requirements. Upon motion duly made and seconded, the following resolution was adopted:

RESOLUTION NO. 8798

BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Commissioners of the Public Building Commission hereby approves the Undertaking Request from the Department of Family and Support Services (DFSS) for the proposed new Bronzeville Regional Center located at 4711-4725 S. Calumet Avenue for an Undertaking Budget of \$29,000,000 inclusive of the \$2,000,000 Partial Undertaking Budget previously approved.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Executive Director and appropriate officials of the Public Building Commission of Chicago are hereby authorized and directed to undertake such actions and execute such documents, upon approval by Legal Counsel, as may be necessary and appropriate in order to effectuate this Resolution.
