The meeting was called to order by Chairman Johnson and the presence of a quorum was established. Chairman Johnson then advised that a public participation period would be conducted pursuant to Section 2.06(g) of the Open Meetings Act and the guidelines for comments established by Resolution No. 7611 approved by the Board of Commissioners on

January 11, 2011. Amanda Englert provided comments regarding community participation and public engagement in the design process for the Morgan Shoal/Pebble Beach Project.

Following the conclusion of the public participation period, the Commissioners were presented with consideration of approval of the minutes of the Regular Meeting of the Board of Commissioners held on October 1, 2025. The reading of said minutes, which had previously been distributed, was dispensed with and upon motion duly made and seconded, the minutes of the October 1, 2025 board meeting were unanimously approved.

Next, the Commissioners were presented with a report by Commissioner Maldonado regarding the Administrative Operations Committee held on November 6, 2025. The Administrative Operations Committee report is summarized as follows:

The Director of Procurement reported on two task order awards for Construction Material Testing & Inspection and Environmental Engineering Specialty Consultant Services.

The Director of Procurement reported on the recommendation of firms to provide Project Development Services to the Public Building Commission and the proposed adoption by the Public Building Commission of the United States General Service Administration contract with E -Builder.

The Director of Procurement recommended approval of an amendment for web-based labor and minority compliance software to LCP Tracker and B2GNow.

The Executive Director reported on Field Orders and provided a recommendation to ratify a Change Order in the credit amount of (\$281,856.50) for the CDOT Capital Program Alleys Package 1 at various locations. The Executive Director also reported on various community outreach opportunities.

The AO Committee accepted the recommendations and reports from the PBC representative.

The next item on the agenda was consideration of approval of the appointment of firms to provide Project Development Services to the Public Building Commission. Executive Director Giderof advised the Commissioners that on August 21, 2025, the Public Building Commission

issued a Request for Proposals (RFP) for Project Development Services to provide support to the PBC Team across planning, design, construction and closeout. Firms were required to provide experienced personnel, respond quickly to project needs, protect PBC interests and offer direct access to decision-makers while maintaining flexibility and adherence to PBC processes and demonstrate commitment to the PBC's MBE/WBE participation and capacity-building efforts. Eleven (11) proposals were received in response to the RFP and reviewed by an Evaluation Committee based on the following criteria: experience and qualifications of the Firm; approach and methodology; experience and qualifications of Key Personnel; Rate Sheet; Value Add; and commitment to MBE/WBE participation and plans to achieve the stated goals. Following review, six (6) respondents were invited to participate in an interview with the Evaluation Committee. During the interview process, the Evaluation Committee requested additional detailed information including: Key Personnel; approach to invoicing and financing logistics; ability to accurately and timely track, manage and report M/WBE compliance and utilization; detailed transition plan; and commitment to student engagement and student hiring. After careful deliberation, the Evaluation Committee recommended the appointment of the following five (5) firms: Ardmore Roderick (MBE); Comprehensive Construction Consulting, Inc. (MBE); Cotter Consulting, LLC; McKissack (M/WBE) + Ochi (MBE) Joint Venture; and Milhouse, Inc. (MBE). Upon approval, a master term agreement with pricing will be negotiated by staff with each firm to provide Project Development Services. Upon motion duly made and seconded, the following Resolution was adopted:

BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED that the Board of Commissioners of the Public Building Commission hereby approves the appointment of the following firms to provide Project Development Services to the Public Building Commission: Ardmore Roderick (MBE); Comprehensive Construction Consulting, Inc. (MBE) Joint Venture; and Milhouse, Inc. (MBE) pursuant to a Master Term Agreement and pricing with each firm for an initial five-year term, with the option to extend the contract for up to three additional one-year periods for a not-to-exceed amount of \$20,000,000.00.

The next item on the agenda was consideration of approval of the adoption of the U.S. General Service Administration (GSA) Contract with e-Builder, Inc. to provide software services for the Public Building Commission of Chicago. Executive Director Giderof advised the Commissioners that GSA entered into an agreement with e-Builder, Inc. (now known as Trimble Unity Construct) to provide fully integrated, cloud-based construction program management software. In view of GSA's requisite due diligence to appropriately evaluate the capabilities of firms offering such services, the Public Building Commission sought and received approval to utilize the GSA's Federal Supply Schedule (FSS) contracts as a local government and has been fully authorized by GSA to utilize the Cooperative Purchasing Program, Disaster Purchasing Program and Public Health Emergencies Program. Following the expiration of PBC's current agreement with e-Builder in February 2026, the Public Building Commission will be able to utilize the advantageous pricing and other terms and conditions under the GSA Contract. Accordingly, the Public Building Commission requests approval to contract with e-Builder under

the existing GSA Contract, which will remain in effect at least through May 30, 2028. Following approval, an agreement with e-Builder will be formalized which will also include commitments to achieve the MBE/WBE participation goals applicable to PBC Professional Services Agreements. Upon motion duly made and seconded, the following Resolution was adopted:

- On October 3, 2025, the March of Dimes – Chicago presented its Construction Award to the Public Building Commission for the Joint Public Safety Training Campus project in

recognition of the innovative project which ensures that First Responders are prepared to serve. The award was presented at the 2025 Construction and Transportation Luncheon and accepted by the Public Building Commission on behalf of its partners, the Department of Fleet and Facility Management and the Office of Public Safety.

- On October 14, 2025, the Public Building Commission hosted a well-attended Pre-Submission Conference and site visit for Design-Build Services for the DFSS Bronzeville Regional Senior Center.
- On October 17, 2025, the Public Building Commission attended Openland's Annual Luncheon to discuss, "Elevating the Voice of Nature".
- On October 21, 2025, the Public Building Commission hosted its Eighth (8th) Annual Assist Agencies Conference which was attended by representatives from various organizations including the African American Contractors Association, Illinois State Black Chamber of Commerce, Hispanic American Construction Industry Association, United States Minority Contractors Association, Women's Business Development Association. The conference provided updates regarding procurement opportunities, continued support for minority and women owned businesses and continued collaboration with Assist Agencies. The next Assist Agency Conference is scheduled for March 24, 2026.
- On October 23, 2025, the Public Building Commission attended the Annual Meeting and Luncheon of the Federation of Women Contractors during which information was provided regarding current and future procurement opportunities, student hiring initiatives and commitment to capacity building within the MBE/WBE community in the areas of construction and professional services.

- On October 28, 2025, the Public Building Commission was pleased to support President Preckwinkle and her team at the Forest Preserve District of Cook County at the ribbon-cutting ceremony for new recreational facilities at the Forest Preserve District’s Beaubien Woods Opening.
- On November 5, 2025, the Public Building Commission hosted a Pre-Submission Conference for Requests for Proposals to be submitted for Construction Document Printing and Online Hosting Services.
- On November 6, 2025, Executive Director Giderof received the 2025 Honorable Justice Thurgood Marshall Legacy Award at the 34th Annual Millennium Builders Awards and STEM Education Scholarship Ceremony hosted by the U. S. Minority Contractors Association.

At the conclusion of the remarks and acknowledgements, the report by the Executive Director was accepted. Chairman Johnson extended Thanksgiving greetings on behalf of the Public Building Commission.

Honorable Chairman and Commissioners:

In 2023, the PBC publicly advertised Requests for Qualifications (RFQ) from firms interested in providing consulting services in the following categories: Construction Material Testing and Inspection, Environmental Engineering Services, among others. In November 2023, the PBC received approval to award term contracts to firms pre-qualified to provide specialty consulting services in this category among others.

In November 2023, a random lottery by category was conducted to establish the rotation to accommodate the recent addition of firms. As services are required, the rotation determines the firm to which a request for pricing is issued. Proposals are reviewed and evaluated for experience, expertise of staff, capacity, past performance, plan of action proposed, and pricing. Upon approval, PBC staff issues a task order against the successful firm's term contract.


